Catholic All Day

Ronald Knox was one of the most influential British convert-writers of the 20th century. Of his many works, *The Belief of Catholics* is his best-known book and his premiere piece of apologetics. While it deals extensively with Protestantism, its target is more the unchurched or lightly-church modern who, if he gives any thought at all to Catholicism, thinks it mildly foreign. As Knox knew, it is not the most difficult part of modern apologetics to convince the devoted Protestant that he has much of Christian truth but now needs to move on to the rest, which is found only in the Catholic Church. The most difficult part is convincing the nominal Protestant (or nominal Catholic), the vaguely religious person, or the person without any religious inclinations that God really does exist, that His existence matters, and that only knowledge of Him and obedience to Him can lead to answers to the questions that haunt everyone. Knox discusses "the truths Catholics hold," "the rules Catholics acknowledge," "the strength Catholics receive," and "the ambitions Catholics honour." These truths, rules, strengths, and ambitions were attractive to the book's first readers. They were answers to the ever-present "Why'." These answers will prove equally attractive to today's readers who, after so many decades of failed isms, yearn for understanding and commitment even more than did their grandparents' generation.

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary dates back to at least the Middle Ages, and has been promoted by a wide variety of saints, always alongside a devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion to the Sacred Heart focuses on reparation for Jesus' suffering and gratitude for his merciful love, while a devotion to the Immaculate Heart is focused on a desire to emulate the love, devotion, and obedience of Our Lady. Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1944 to be celebrated on August 22, coinciding with the traditional octave day of the Assumption. In 1969, Pope Paul VI moved the celebration to the Saturday following the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (the third Saturday after Pentecost). But the August devotion to the Immaculate Heart still remains, and the month contains important feast days in honor of Our Lady. In this month's booklet you'll find prayers for the Feast of Our Lady, Queen of Angels and the very cool associated Portiuncula Indulgence of St. Francis of Assisi, also for the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the feast of the Queenship of Mary, which now occupies the octave day of the Assumption. There are also prayers and devotions in honor of August saints including St. Lawrence, St. Clare, St. Bartholomew, St. John the Baptist (for his second feast day of the year, commemorating his death), and the mother-son pair of St. Monica and St. Augustine.

Tell Me about the Catholic Faith

In November, the Church asks that we focus our prayers on the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Catechism explains: All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. (CCC 1030) And we can help make that happen! Beginning on All Saints' Day on November 1, the faithful can gain a plenary indulgence-applicable only to the Holy Souls- every day for eight days by praying for the dead in a cemetery. On November 2 only, the plenary indulgence can be gained in either a cemetery or in a Church. Any prayers can be used. Our favorites are included here. Praying for the dead in our local cemetery each year has become a tradition that we really value. Even our little kids can understand how important it is to pray for and make sacrifices for those who can no longer do so for themselves. We use this month to remember the beloved dead in our own family, and to pray specifically for souls who don't have anyone else to pray for them. The month begins with the celebration of those who have already made it to the final goal: heaven! On All Saints' Day we remember all our favorite saints on the liturgical calendar, but especially all the saints in heaven who haven't been officially canonized, and so don't have their own feast days. These even include our own beloved dead who we have reason to hope died in God's grace and without attachment to sin. November saints who do have their own feast days include Saint Martin of Tours and Saint Catherine of Alexandria. Included in this booklet are prayers to and/or by them, plus prayers for Veterans'/Remembrance Day and a cool historical litany to the Fourteen Holy Helpers (of which Saint Catherine is one). The month, and the liturgical year, end with the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and one last opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence.

And by employing both Nahuatl and Maya religious texts, Nahua and Maya Catholicism allows for a uniquely comparative study that expands beyond Central Mexico to include Yucatan.

This booklet of prayers is a comprehensive collection of Catholic prayers you might wish to use on any given day, but NOT with the expectation that you would use every prayer every day, or even that you would use every prayer ever! Prayers are included that are traditionally used at different times of day. For instance, the Morning Offering, the noon Angelus, the 3pm Divine Mercy Chaplet, and night prayers. Also included are prayers for before and after Mass, meals, and work, and various prayers you might wish to offer for other people. You'll find prayers for traditional devotions like a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, and the Rosary. If you are just beginning to include regular prayer in your daily life, it's best to start in a small and manageable way, with perhaps a Morning Offering and Grace Before Meals. Then, as you become more used to the habit, you can slowly add in new prayers and devotions, like a noon Angelus, a daily family Rosary, and an Examination of Conscience and Act of Contrition at night. If you are able to add daily Mass, a Visit to the Blessed Sacrament, and/or the Sacrament of Confession to your weekly routine, you can use the included prayers here to help you prepare and focus.
