Breaking Into Acting

The Actor's Tool Kit: The Beginning Actor's Practical Guide to Acting is a beginning acting textbook that can be used in class or individually. It highlights the KIP System of training for beginning and intermediate acting students. Methodical preparation will pay dividends when exploring these fascinating characters. I hope you enjoy working on them.
