Shots rang out in Savannah's grandest mansion in the misty, early morning hours of May 2, 1981. Was it murder or self-defense? For nearly a decade, the

shooting and its aftermath reverberated throughout this hauntingly beautiful city of moss-hung oaks and shaded squares. Brilliantly conceived and masterfully written, this enormously engaging portrait of a most beguiling Southern city has become a modern classic.

In the Garden of the Fugitives

The title sequence of Making the Beds for the Dead charts the journey of the Foot and Mouth virus in 'the plague year'. Grant, and appreciates ordinary Blue Lake string beans, but abhors the Asiatic lily. The sources of her inspiration -- seed catalogues, the gardener Gertrude Jekyll, gardens like Monet's at Giverny -- are subjected to intense scrutiny. She also examines the idea of the garden on Antigua, where she grew up. *My Garden* (Book) is an intimate, playful, and penetrating book on gardens, the plants that fill them, and the persons who tend them.
