Madurese is a major regional language of Indonesia, with some 14 million speakers, mainly on the island of Madura and adjacent parts of Java, making it the fourth largest language of Indonesia after Indonesian, Javanese, and Sundanese. There is no existing comprehensive descriptive grammar of the language, with existing studies being either sketches of the whole grammar, or detailed descriptions of phonology and morphology or some particular topics within these components of the grammar. There is no competing work that provides the breadth and depth of coverage of this grammar, in particular (though not exclusively) with regard to syntax.

Practical Grammar Bahasa Indonesia

Practical grammar Bahasa Indonesia is an extended grammar resource of the national language of Indonesia. The book contains a simplified but comprehensive approach to learning and deepening the basic structure of the Indonesian language which contains a brief explanation of the rules of the language and fully illustrated with sentence elements of standard Bahasa Indonesia. The example of sentences plays an important role in this method. Users of this book can later easily reproduce these standard phrases for other purposes in another communicative environment, both in spoken and in written Indonesian. However, scientific research

shows that doing and/or copying standard sentences is the most important and easiest way to learn a (new) language. The simple and clear structure of this book will help the users step by step to fully master the grammar of Indonesian. This book explains the rules and further gives a good index to find things that newcomers in the Indonesian language have problems with.
