(Cf. Whelehan 1999: 9) This essay examines the differences and similarities between the novel Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone and its film adaptation. It points out problems that occur when transposing a text to screen, and raises the question of the film's authenticity towards the novel. Firstly, different critics are going to be scrutinized to get a better understanding of the discrepancy between literary criticism and film studies. Secondly, the characteristics of each medium shall be pointed at, combined with possible arising advantages and disadvantages. The following section evaluates the fictional source Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone versus the filmic source, asking the question of the primary importance of the origin text.
