Women Painters of the World

This is an extensive analysis of the relation of erotic philosophy to homosexuality in the modern period. The book focuses on homoerotic (mis)appropriations and subversions of homoerotic conceptions of romantic love in texts by eight authors: Oscar Wilde, Andre Gide, Ronald Firbank, Virginia Woolf, Gertrude Stein, Marguerite Yourcenar, Mary Renault and Roland Barthes. In doing so, the author both positions these authors as experimental and influential erotic theorists and protests against the critical undervaluation of love (as opposed to desire) in the construction of sexuality as we know it.

Juana Romani, il corpo e la patria è un primo tentativo di riportare alla luce il destino della pittrice italiana Juana Romani, nata a Velletri nel 1867 e morta a Suresnes in una clinica per malati mentali nel 1923. Lo scritto analizza il rapporto della pittrice con l'arte, il proprio corpo e quindi con la patria e il suo paese d'origine. Patria che il mito "simbolista" del Rinascimento e dell'Italia aveva reso come un puro ideale da perseguire. La Romani partecipa regolarmente ai Salon parigini. Le sue opere vengono comperate dallo Stato francese e molti suoi quadri entrano a far parte delle collezioni private delle grandi famiglie aristocratiche che dominano Parigi, dai Rothschild ai Murat, dai Luynes ai Palmela. È amica di Henner, Roybet, Armand Silvestre, Carolus Duran, Antoine Guillemet, Feyen-Perrin, Cormon ed è maestra di pittura di Antoine Lumière, padre dei famosi fratelli inventori del cinematografo. La pittrice,

nata nella piena povertà, entra nella élite dei ritrattisti della capitale francese, ma la sua sensibilità d'artista e donna, le sue incertezze d'origine, forse stessa fonte del suo talento, unite all'ambiente chiuso e feroce dell'alta società, non possono che condizionarla ponendo le basi della follia. I suoi quadri, sparsi nel mondo, frutto di un tormentato percorso personale e artistico, restano i muti testimoni di una personalità istrionica e attraente, debole e tenacemente patriottica.
